
About the Tennessee Aquarium

The Tennessee Aquarium, a non-profit organization located

on the banks of the Tennessee River in Downtown Chattanooga, is renowned for its dedication to freshwater conservation, education, economic impact, and community engagement.

Since its opening in 1992 when it was dubbed "a cathedral to conservation," the Aquarium has been a catalyst for the city's "Renaissance on the River." No single project has played a more significant role in revitalizing the downtown area and creating a welcoming and inviting atmosphere for residents, as well as the more than 28 million guests worldwide who have visited the Aquarium. Dozens of cities from across the country have sent delegations to Chattanooga to study this model of reinvigorating a city's central core with the hope of replicating this success.

Guests travel from "the mountains to the sea" within the Aquarium's two buildings, River Journey and Ocean Journey. Freshwater habitats within River Journey introduce guests to an Appalachian Cove Forest where feisty North American river otters romp within a living forest under the Aquarium's glass peaks. This walk in the woods helps set the stage for an exploration of how our most important natural resource – fresh water – connects all life as it flows from the Great Smoky Mountains to the Gulf of Mexico. Along the way, visitors encounter colorful native southeastern freshwater fishes, American alligators patrolling a delta swamp, unusual species from rivers around the world, and an entire gallery dedicated to efforts to save turtles from extinction.



Next door in Ocean Journey, guests are introduced to marine and island habitats that celebrate the diversity of life beyond the biological hotspot of the Southeast. Lemurs, butterflies, penguins, and flashlight fish stand out among a richly diverse group of saltwater species like jellies, octopus, sharks, rays, and one very large green sea turtle.

The Tennessee Aquarium IMAX 3D Theater, located across the street from the Aquarium, first opened in 1996. The cinematic experience is unparalleled in our region with its six-story screen, IMAX with Laser projection system, and 12-channel sound system. New seats and a new concessions experience have been added in the past year to ensure the theater provides the best possible guest experience. In addition to its educational mission of showing environmental documentaries that complement the Aquarium experience, the theater has been programming Hollywood blockbusters like *Dune* and *Oppenheimer* drawing additional guests from throughout the region.

In 2023, the Aquarium's senior leadership team and board of trustees began devoting resources to a long-term visioning process that focused on building towards a future of continued success. With the help of consultants, surveys, and feasibility work, employees and external stakeholders have participated in dreaming big and sharing thoughts on how the bridge to the future might be built over the coming decades. Bold ideas and key insights have been revealed through this visioning process, which is ongoing, and this will help lay the groundwork for the Aquarium to move forward with confidence. The next President and CEO will have the opportunity to shape and solidify these ideas and insights by helping to develop and execute a new strategic plan. Chattanoogans have always embraced the Tennessee Aquarium as "Our Aquarium." They have witnessed its regional impact over more than three decades. We believe they are now primed and ready to help us ensure the Aquarium, and Chattanooga, remain a premiere destination for the next 30 years.

Position Summary

The President and CEO is the most

senior level position at the Tennessee Aquarium and reports directly to the Board of Trustees. The President and CEO oversees all functions of the Aquarium and has a seven-person senior management team. The President and CEO also leads the commitment to a culture of diversity, equity, accessibility, and inclusion throughout the organization and within the community.

The President and CEO is responsible for leading a fiscally sound and well-balanced overall operation. This includes the Tennessee Aquarium, the Tennessee Aquarium IMAX 3D Theater, the Tennessee Aquarium Conservation Institute, and all assets of the private, nonprofit organization.









The President and CEO also leads the strategic vision and growth of the organization, guiding the planning and implementation of fundraising practices to generate ongoing support, steer future expansion projects, and continually grow the base of donors and supporters.

As the organization's public face, the President and CEO integrates the strategic direction from the Board into the Aquarium's day-to-day operational plans and serves as the interface between the internal and external stakeholders and the local community.

The President and CEO communicates the organization's purpose, vision, mission, core values, strategic plan, and overall community impact to inspire everyone within the organization to meet or exceed all of its objectives while generating broad community support for our mission.

Essential Duties & Responsibilities

Mission Advancement

- The President and CEO will engage with and provide thought leadership to local government officials and partners like River City Company, Chattanooga Tourism Company, the Chattanooga Design Studio, Hunter Museum of American Art, Creative Discovery Museum and the Downtown Chattanooga Alliance to promote and advocate for the Aquarium's interests and strategic plans as the city grows.
- Serve as the highest-ranking spokesperson for the organization and be ultimately responsible for the organization's reputation and relationships with internal and external stakeholders, including staff, volunteers, board members, community partners, funders, local government, and the media.
- Provide a positive and resilient leadership style to the senior management team, staff, and volunteers.
- Develop the organization's strategic plan, including mission, vision, core values, goals, and objectives, with the board of trustees, the senior management team, and the director of inclusion, equity, and diversity.
- Ensure an elevated level of program quality, including regular tracking, evaluation, and reporting on measures of success.
- Serve as an education and conservation champion who is committed to using the Aquarium's platform and community trust to advocate for all aspects of protecting water and wildlife.
- Remain current on trends and issues in the zoo and aquarium profession to provide leadership
 that ensures the Tennessee Aquarium retains its accreditation with the Association of Zoos
 and Aquariums and remains at the forefront of animal wellbeing, conservation, education, and
 sustainability.
- Demonstrate decision-making supporting appropriate cultural sensitivity, dedication, compassion, and authenticity.
- Provide opportunities for professional development to grow and retain staff expertise while increasing the organization's reputation for leadership.



Financial Sustainability

- Set vision and goals to effectively coordinate development and fundraising efforts with the Aquarium's development team.
- Demonstrate a record of success and proficiency at fundraising and cultivating donors in both one-on-one and group settings.
- Raise funds to support organizational operations from a variety of sources, including government grants, foundations, corporate, and individual donors.
- Demonstrate the ability to engage with various individuals, including high-wealth donors, legislators, and civic and community leaders.

 ensuring compliance with all financial policies and providing regular reporting to the Board of

 maintenance and provisions for adequate funding to support, maintain, advance, and enhance
 the on-site and off-site campus locations.
- Develop a long-range financial plan and strategic plan.

- Assemble a diverse and inclusive Board of Trustees that is highly engaged and willing to leverage and secure financial resources to ensure the organization's future success.
- Cultivate a strong, transparent working relationship with the Board of Trustees and provide accurate, complete, and timely information on the organization's programs, services, and finances.
- Inform and advise the Board regarding current trends, challenges, and opportunities critical to the organization's mission and operations.
- Present appropriate verbal and written communication and presentation skills, with a record of being socially aware and astute while remaining apolitical.
- Seek opportunities to serve on local and statewide boards and represent the Aquarium at national conferences and meetings while networking to advance the Aquarium's mission.
- Collaborate with all professional colleagues to facilitate growth in attendance, membership, funding, and development opportunities.
- Introduce the Aquarium to new, diverse audiences and professional associations.

- Implement the necessary financial, human resources, and other management and administrative policies and procedures for the organization and bring relevant policies to the Board of Trustees for review and approval. Ensure regular salary and benefits surveys are completed and adequate adjustments are made to maintain a high-performing staff at a competitive level.

- Establish "guest satisfaction" as a high priority in all business areas.
- Oversee the creation of contingency plans and emergency/crisis plans.
- Prioritize the legal and ethical integrity of the organization and monitor its compliance with all applicable laws and regulations.

- Knowledge and experience managing senior-level staff and operational teams.
- Excellent verbal/written communication skills as well as presentation skills.
- Knowledge of or active engagement with a positive presence in social media.
- A solid professional reputation, record of integrity, sound judgment, and respect for established ethical standards.
- Social dynamism and confidence in large groups, with an ability to multitask, provide strong attention to detail, and meet deadlines.
- Vision and creativity to motivate staff and influence community leaders; to engage and foster relationships with the community, public and private agencies, and the Tennessee Aquarium Board of Trustees.

- A bachelor's degree is required, and an advanced degree is preferred.
- Seven or more years of experience in a senior leadership position is required.
- Seven or more years of experience in fundraising, fiscal management, budgeting, and financial forecasting is required.
- Experience and strong skills in leadership, management, and supervision in a forprofit or nonprofit organization.
- An energetic leadership style with a passion for animals and their welfare.
- Excellent verbal/written communication reflecting diplomacy and discretion.
- Experience and comfort working with media in person, in front of a recording device, or in print.
- Proven crisis management experience with a strong safety background.
- Strong skills in MS Office and other computer systems.
